booked by other members of the group.



Local twinning forum?

The twinning committee is trying to establish contacts with other local twinning groups to see if we might share ideas about how to keep twinning in the public arena and how to encourage more people to get involved. It seems that an ageing membership and dwindling interest after early enthusiasm are common themes in twinning.

A forum already exists to link groups in the Vale of the White Horse area and we are hoping that speaking to them could help us in our quest.
